Use these questions as a guideline to facilitate discussion and response after viewing the film with your family, small group or event leadership group.

Problem

What did you know about Guatemala before watching Reparando? What did you learn?

Civil war is devastating to a country. What are some of the real consequences of war on a country that may or may not have been shown in the film?

Food, shelter, love and hope. The essentials for a life-sustaining environment. What happens in the absence of these essentials?

Think back to when you were 10 years old—where you lived and what your life was like. What would you have done at that age if you lost your family due to violence and abandonment?

What is a 'cultural misconception'? What impact can a misconception have? What cultural misconceptions do you see in your neighborhood, church, school or organization?

Repairing

What can you learn from the lives of Shorty, Tita, Maria and others in the film?

In the film, Shorty says "It doesn't matter who you are, where you've been or what you have done. God still loves you." How does this statement impact you? How has your life been repaired?

Tita, Shorty and Maria have gone against all odds to turn their lives around and help the least, the last and the lost in their community. How have you used a painful experience in your past to turn it around for the good?

Who are the people in your life struggling to find hope? How can you be helpful in their situation? What have you done or can you do to repair the lives of others?

Impact

Finish this sentence: "After watching Reparando, I..."

La Limonada is the largest slum in Central America with over 60,000 residents. Though there may not be a place of that size and scale near you, what is the La Limonada in your life where you are being called to help build hope?

What does it mean to be a 'trophy of grace'? How do you see yourself in that light?

Reparando is a story of God's redemptive grace poured into the lives of people being woven together to create a beautiful tapestry within the people of Guatemala. Each thread has a purpose within the larger tapestry, each serving a part in the larger picture. Take a moment to reflect about the people around you whose lives you closely connect with. Describe your tapestry.

What can you do to give or go in your world?
